Dear Parents/Carers of children in Year 5 (from the Summer term) and Year 6,

Walking To and From School Alone Request

As you know, we have been undertaking a review for our end of day routines to ensure the care and safety of our Year 6 pupils with regards to the end of day arrangements. As part of our continual assessment of our safeguarding procedures we would like to ensure that we have an up to date register of all children who have permission to walk home alone. If you give permission for your child to walk to and from school alone, please complete the request details below.

In deciding whether your child is ready to walk to school you should read our 'Travelling To and From School Alone Policy,' assess any risks associated with the route and your child's confidence. We recommend that you work with your child/ren to build up their independence while walking to and from school through route finding, road safety skills and general awareness. There are many ways you can prepare your child to make an Independent journey. Children who are driven to school do not have the opportunity to develop road awareness and are therefore more vulnerable when they start to walk to school independently.

I understand that the school accepts no responsibility for my child's safety and/or wellbeing once they have left the school gates and are no longer being supervised by members of staff.

I have discussed the following issues and dangers associated with walking to and from school alone with my child and I am satisfied that they understand the issues and are responsible. Please tick the following to acknowledge the issues discussed with your child/ren:

- Road Safety:** do not walk in the middle of roads e.g. Church Street, stay on paths and observe the Highway Code i.e crossing roads safely, listen for traffic, look both ways, cross while keeping an eye on traffic, look out for cyclists
- Stranger Danger:** do not talk to anyone they do not know; do not get into an adults car without parent's permission
- Barrowby Play Park:** go straight home and do not play in the park
- Friendship Group:** do not play with your friends in the village or the park, go straight home
- I have made arrangements for an adult to be at home when they arrive at home

Attend extra-curricular activities at the end of the school day that they have been signed up to. I will arrange collection from school, after the extra-curricular activity at the designated time by an adult.

Attend Wrap Around Care sessions booked in with the After-School Club. I will arrange collection from the Old School Room by an adult.

Attend School Visits organised by the school which may overrun at the end of the school day e.g. arrive back at school after 3.15pm. I will arrange collection at the designated finish time of the visit by an adult.
