Here are the results from our recent survey, which I hope you will find interesting. Thank you for your many positive comments regarding our School Vision. 127 (48.47%) parents responded to this online (ParentmailX) questionnaire. Results were as follows: (0.78% = one respondent)

Would you consider the term, 'school family' an appropriate way of describing our school community? Yes 92.9%

Does your child feel happy at our school, most of the time? Yes 99.2%

Do you feel we support and/or encourage your child/ren to do their very best e.g. strive for excellence? Yes 96.1%

Have you read our school's Curriculum Overview information available on the website? Yes 78.7%

Do you feel our school's curriculum supports your child/ren to do well? e.g. using information received through the Annual Report, Parent/Teacher Consultation etc Yes 97.6%

Do you feel the school acknowledges and celebrate successes e.g. newsletter, certificates through Collective Worship? Yes 98.4%

Do you feel the school promotes equal opportunities for all? Yes 93.7%

Do you agree with the school values: Creativity, Respect and Independence? Yes 99.2%

Are there any other values you would like the school to explore? Yes 30.7%
