#### **BARROWBY PARISH COUNCIL COMMUNITY CONSULTATION - DECEMBER 2022**

The Parish Council would like to thank all those residents who completed and returned the Community Consultation before Christmas. Roughly 10% of the distributed questionnaires were returned, providing 83 responses. Sincere thanks go to those respondents who took the time and trouble to express their gratitude to the Parish Council and for the consultation opportunity.

The results showed that the answers to several questions were very much aligned in one direction, whilst others represented a mixed view. The results are offered below.

Q2. Should we reduce the frequency of flower bed planting?	36	43	4
Q3. Should we reduce the frequency of mowing green areas?	53	30	0
Q4. Should we mothball some flower beds but maintain the others to a high standard?	27	54	2
Q5. Should we seek additional volunteers to help maintain flower beds?	6	76	1
Q6. Are you prepared to volunteer personally?	43	39	1
Q7. Should we seek sponsorship of local businesses and organisations to support our flower bed maintenance?	6	77	0
Q8. Should the Parish Council generate additional income by raising hire rates for its resources?	9	73	1
Q9. Should we increase the precept by £6.50 per annum?	20	63	0
Q10. Would you support more chargeable community events?	16	63	4

The Parish Council will now take this data into consideration and determine how to move forward into the new financial year as they set next year's precept. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT EVERY PENNY RAISED BY THE BARROWBY PRECEPT IS SPENT ENTIRELY WITHIN THE PARISH. The Parish Council will be following up the

offers of voluntary help by holding a meeting (date to be set) to explain how residents might help with managing the flower beds, which seem to be greatly appreciated by villagers. Sweet peas - sow seeds end of January Broad beans - sow seeds under cover by the end of the month

Onions - sow seeds for show crops/larger varieties Seed Potatoes – buy now as they appear in shops Shallots - buy sets for planting in February

#### **NEW YEAR GARDENING TIPS**

Gladioli - order new corms and check existing corms for fungus

Dahlias - check for rot and remove. If shrivelled, plunge into a bucket of tepid water to restore Geranium - check plants for any diseased foliage
