In particular, have a look at the amount of children who achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths-both in Year 2 (82.9%) and at Year6 (85.7%). These were both +30% higher than the local authority and the National data. This year promises to be a good year, so with hard work, determination and a pinch of Creativity, Respect and Independence, we will see.

Please also have a look at the <u>Year 6 Leaver's Survey</u>-completed by our outgoing Year 6 children last July. It fills me with so much pride when I read that all the children tell us they have enjoyed being a part of Barrowby CE Primary School, that they are proud of their achievements and all felt supported, on their journey. I hope their doing as well in their secondary school.s
