This week, our very own Mrs Walton escorted us to the church grounds where we saw three large bee hives. We were totally safe as all the bees were asleep this time of year, thank goodness!

Mrs Walton took one of the uninhabited hives apart for us to see the wax that the bees made last season. As Mrs Walton is a beekeeper herself, we learned that bees make the wax using the glands in their back legs. She then told us how to help the bees by putting a sugar syrup drink out for them, which is what we did. Each child made a solution for the bees and placed it in our school wildlife area.
