E-Safety Parent Workshop

As a part of your child's education at Barrowby CE Primary school we aim to promote safer use of computers, the internet and the ever-growing technological world we now live in. As part of our computing curriculum, we envisage to support our children with the knowledge and tools to keep them safe from threats and dangers of the online world.



These risks are grouped into four categories:

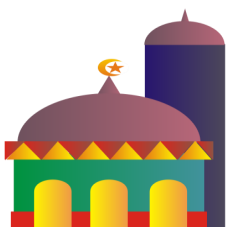
1. Conduct: children's behaviour may put them at risk
2. Content: access to inappropriate or unreliable content may put children at risk
3. Contact: interaction with unsuitable, unpleasant or dangerous people may put children at risk
4. Commercialism: children's use of platforms with hidden costs may put them at risk

Talking to your child can be a daunting prospect, but it's important. Your children need to know they can talk to you if something does go wrong, when working or socialising online. It is because of these challenges that we would like to invite you and your child to attend an E-Safety workshop with Mr Caton. This presentation will be delivered in school on **Tuesday 11th February 2025 from 5.00pm - 6.00pm.**

We hope you will be able to join us for the presentation. It will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have or to voice any concerns around e-safety, use of social media or support you can provide at home.

Year 5 visit to St Phillips Centre & Mosque

As part of our ongoing work to broaden our pupil's experiences, on Wednesday 12th February 2025 our Year 5 children will be visiting the St. Philip's Centre, as part of their RE studies, in Leicester.



While at the centre they will participate in faith based 'compare and contrast' interactive learning and activities. They will then reflect on the differences between Barrowby and Leicester in terms of faith diversity and have the opportunity to ask any questions they may have.

The children will also visit a mosque. Whilst there they will have the opportunity to speak to a Muslim faith practitioner. They will learn about the history and development of Islam as well as Muslim ways of worship and living. They will also gain a deeper understanding of the purpose and features of a mosque.

Children will need to be in their full school uniform and girls should also take a scarf to cover their head.

All children will also need to take a packed lunch and their water bottles. Should you wish to place an order for a packed lunch for this visit with our hot school meal provider, The Farm Kitchen will offer this option for you to order for your child. Your order will need to be placed by Tuesday 4th February at 3.00pm.
