



## Barrowby Church of England Primary School Out of School Clubs Survey Summary

Thank you for completing the survey regarding your experience of your child starting here at Barrowby CE Primary School. We received 144 forms which were returned, out of a possible 240 (60% response rate). Each response is 0.69%.

**Thank you for your feedback:**

Most families found out about clubs through personal networks, with word of mouth accounting for the largest share (43.1%). Social media (19.4%) and "other" sources (19.4%) were also common, while the school newsletter played a smaller but notable role (18.1%).



### **Question 7:**

Are you aware of the club links section on our school website?

### **Question 8:**

Is your child active for at least 30 minutes outside of school? This does not have to be through attending clubs, this can be achieved through going to the park, playing in the garden, etc.

#### ***Thank you for your feedback:***

*It is extremely encouraging that 97.2% of families report their child is active for at least 30 minutes a day outside of school, whether through play, outdoor time, or informal activity.*

*This aligns strongly with national initiatives such as Keeping Children Active and the wider aim of supporting every child to achieve 30 active minutes beyond the school day.*

#### **Summary of Findings**

A total of 144 responses were received providing a strong evidence base across the whole school.

- Male children: 47.2% (68 responses)
- Female children: 50.7% (73 responses)
- Prefer not to say: 2.1% (3 responses)
- Other: 0%

The gender split of children attending out-of-school clubs is broadly even, with 47.2% male and 50.7% female, and only a very small proportion choosing not to disclose. Responses were also well distributed across all year groups, ensuring balanced representation.

Participation in out-of-school activities is high, with two-thirds of children (66.7%) involved in sports clubs. A further 21.5% take part in activities such as Scouts/Guides, theatre groups, horse-riding or similar, while 9% engage in music or dance and 2.8% in arts or craft-based clubs. This reflects a broad and healthy spread of interests across pupils.



Comments show a strong concentration around a number of well-established local providers.

These providers appear to form the core of the local offer that families consistently rely on.

Swimming, in particular, continues to feature prominently, reflecting its importance to parents both for safety and confidence.

Overall, the survey results indicate that pupils are widely engaged in a diverse range of out-of-school activities. Established community clubs play a major role in children's weekly routines, and families value both the physical and social benefits these opportunities provide.
