Indian Experience Day

The day began with a whole-school collective worship, where Sunita captivated everyone with an animated retelling of the story of Holi, the festival of colour. Children were enthralled as she described the joy, symbolism, and traditions behind this celebration. Her expressive storytelling brought the festival to life, and pupils loved watching scenes of Holi being celebrated across the world.

Sunita then shared how Hindu worship takes place in her own home. She spoke to the children about Hindu worship at home, explained the significance of different Hindu Gods, described the tradition of offering food as an act of devotion, burning incense and ringing a bell.

Throughout the day, each year group took part in a special workshop tailored to their learning: Our Year 3 children enjoyed a lively traditional dance session, dressing in colourful saris and learning expressive movements linked to Hindu celebrations. Their enthusiasm filled the hall with energy and smiles.

Our Year 4 explored the beautiful art of Rangoli patterns, creating vibrant designs using colour, shape, and symmetry. Their finished pieces are stunning, and we cannot wait to display them proudly around school.

Our Year 5 took part in a thoughtful workshop offering a deeper insight into Hindu worship, ceremonies, and beliefs. They learned about some of the many Gods within Hinduism and explored how different rituals are used to express devotion. A question-and-answer session allowed pupils to explore their own thoughtful queries.

Our Year 6 engaged in a session exploring Indian culture through the lens of Hindu lifestyles, diversity, and the importance of challenging stereotypes. They discussed how Hinduism is practised in different ways and how assumptions can be replaced with understanding. Their Q&A session led to some excellent, reflective conversations.



The day was a wonderful celebration of learning, understanding, and respect. We are incredibly grateful to Sunita for sharing her knowledge, warmth, and passion with us once again. Her visit has deepened our pupils' appreciation of Hinduism and enriched our school community in a truly special way.

All children return to school on Monday 1st June 2026.

Year 6 London Residential Medical Meeting

Please ensure any medication e.g. travel sickness, asthma etc. is brought into school on **Wednesday 3rd June 2025**, between 3.15 and 3.45pm. The adults who are accompanying the children will be based in the Year 6 classroom and are on hand to discuss any of the finer details for your child and can complete the necessary paperwork, with you.

Please ensure you bring the medication form entitled, 'Administering Medication on the London Residential Visit' and that all medicines are clearly labelled in an envelope, with:

- your child's name
- required dose
- time to be administered

If your child has medication in school, you do not need to provide a further supply of this, all medication will be taken on the visit with the adults accompanying this visit.

Reception Induction Visit

Children will be given the opportunity to experience some of the activities which they will encounter when they start school in September. 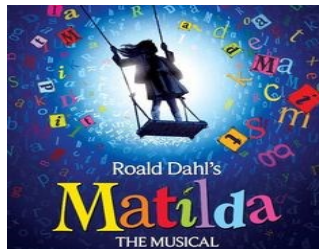


Year 6 London Residential Visit

Our Year 6 London Residential Visit will take place on Thursday 4th June - Friday 5th June 2026. Children are to arrive at school for **7.45am for a prompt departure at 8.00am**. We are very much looking forward to this visit.

Kit List -

- Pocket money to be brought in a named purse/wallet (£30 maximum). To be used for: souvenirs e.g. Tower of London, Matilda Program; ice cream during interval; light refreshment while at Harry Potter e.g. Butter Beer etc.
- Cameras (labelled) are recommended but please ensure that your child is aware that they are responsible for their own belongings. **Children should not bring mobile phones** – adults accompanying the children will have phones which can be used if necessary.
- A bag for children to carry their water, cameras e.g. Rucksack, PE Bag.
- For the visit, children should wear their full school uniform (including Barrowby School jumper/cardigan; skirts for girls, knee length white socks-no summer dress; trousers for boys-no shorts) and comfortable footwear.
- A waterproof coat or jacket.

The Mini Olympics provides children with the opportunity to try many Olympic and Paralympic sports. In addition, the children will get the chance to meet our VIP sports personalities in our 'Meet the Stars' area.

The teams are assisted by the schools Bronze Young Ambassadors. This year's event is going to be the biggest yet with over 850 primary school children taking part!

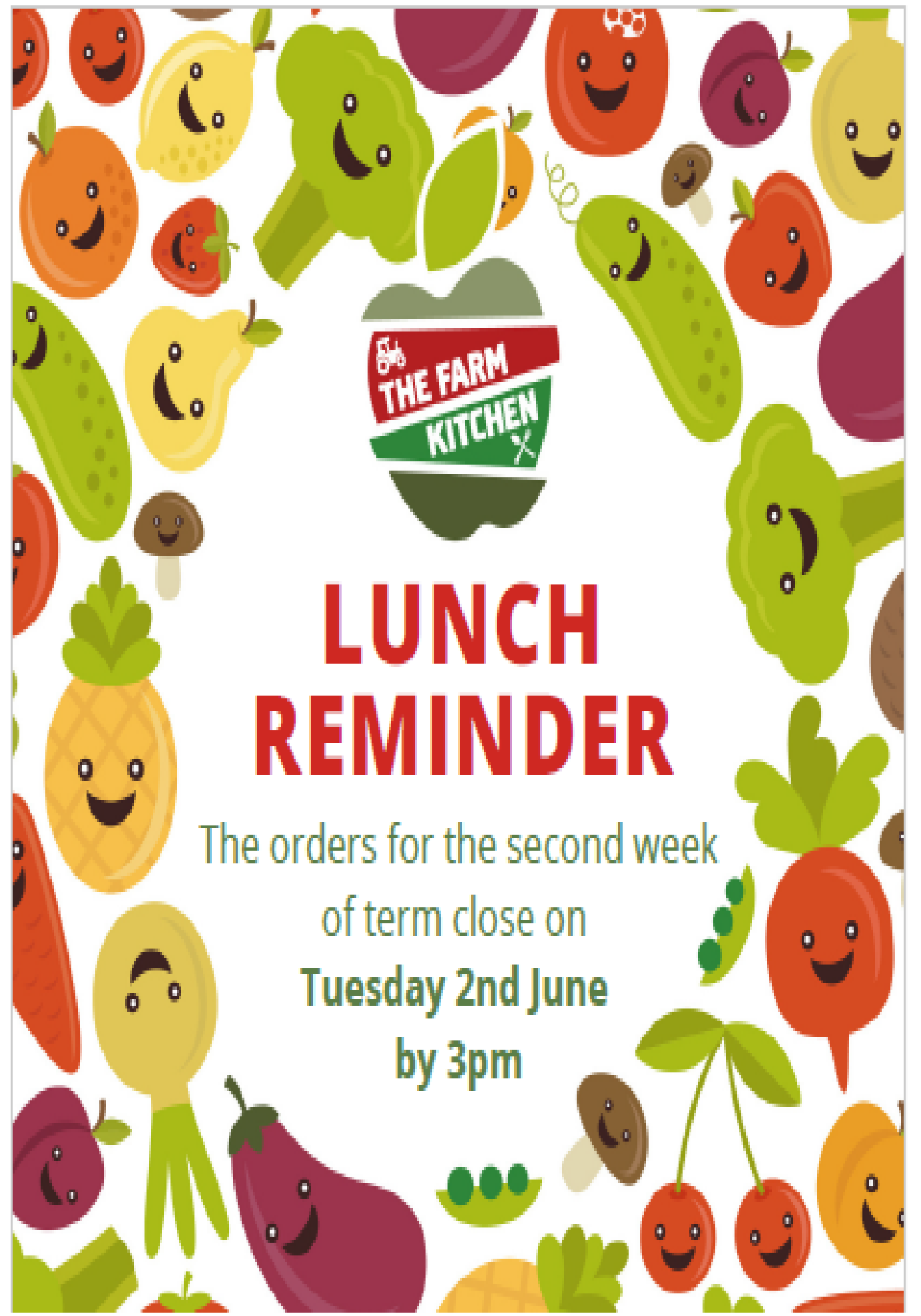
