Arts Summary 2019-20

At Barrowby CE Primary School, we are committed to encouraging all our pupils to lead creative lives. This is achieved through an extensive program of activities, available both within and outside of our curriculum and within the wider community which enable our children to:

- foster a love of arts;
- develop specific creative skills; as well as
- teaching them about the importance of cooperation and team-work.

On Thursday 7th February 2019, our school was notified that our Artsmark application had been screened and validated and that we, as a school have been awarded the Gold Artsmark.

In 2014, we first gained the Artsmark award which celebrated all that we do as a school in both Performing and Visual Arts. Last year, Mrs Webster and Mr Batey began the process of re-evaluating our school's provision and its impact on our pupils within the Arts. The Case Study was re-submitted: with Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum available.

We are delighted that our school has been awarded the Gold Artsmark which recognises our school's commitment to the arts as well as, Mrs Webster, our Arts Leader being invited to become an Artsmark Ambassador: supporting other schools developing their arts provision.

In Autumn Term 2019, we offered 15 arts related clubs:

- 270 places were allocated to pupils.
- In 116 total pupils (50.8% of the whole school years 1 to 6) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Autumn 2019.

Gender Analysis Autumn 2019

Key Stage 1

- Girls: 11 girls (35.4%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 13 boys (36.1%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

Key Stage 2

- Girls: 68 girls (76.4%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 42 boys (61.7%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

Whole School (Y1-6)

- Girls: 79 girls (65.8%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 55 boys (52.3%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

There were 13 girl's places (KS1) and 162 girl's places (KS2), in total 175 girl's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular clubs, including girls who were doing multiple arts clubs.

There were 14 boy's places (KS1) and 85 boy's places (KS2), in total 99 boy's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular activities, including boys who were doing multiple arts clubs.

In Spring Term 2020, we offered 16 arts related clubs:

- 420 places were allocated to pupils.
- In total 177 pupils (78% of the whole school years 1 to 6) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Spring 2020.

Gender Analysis Spring 2020

Key Stage 1

- Girls: 25 girls (80%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 22 boys (61%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

Key Stage 2

- Girls: 85 girls (95%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 45 boys (75%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

Whole School (Y1-6)

- Girls: 110 girls (92%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.
- Boys: 67 boys (64%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity.

There were 37 girl's places (KS1) and 241 girl's places (KS2), in total 278 girl's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular clubs, including girls who were doing multiple arts clubs.

There were 35 boy's places (KS1) and 107 boy's places (KS2), in total 142 boy's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular activities, including boys who were doing multiple arts clubs.
