Arts Summary 2018-19

At Barrowby CE Primary School, we are committed to encouraging all our pupils to lead creative lives. This is achieved through an extensive program of activities, available both within and outside of our curriculum and within the wider community which enable our children to:

- foster a love of arts;
- develop specific creative skills; as well as
- teaching them about the importance of cooperation and team-work.

On Thursday 7th February 2019, our school was notified that our Artsmark application had been screened and validated and that we, as a school have been awarded the Gold Artsmark.

In 2014, we first gained the Artsmark award which celebrated all that we do as a school in both Performing and Visual Arts. Last year, Mrs Webster and Mr Batey began the process of re-evaluating our school's provision and its impact on our pupils within the Arts. The Case Study was re-submitted: with Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum available.

We are delighted that our school has been awarded the Gold Artsmark which recognises our school's commitment to the arts

- In total 110 pupils (49% of the whole school years 1 to 6) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Autumn 2018.

- In total 180 pupils (80% of the whole school years 1 to 6) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Spring 2019.
