In Autumn Term 2015, we offered 13 arts related clubs, an increase from last Autumn:

- 237 places (an increase of 56) were allocated to pupils.
- In total 122 pupils (55% of whole school)
   participated in an arts
- extra-curricular club in Autumn 2015.

In Autumn Term 2016, we offered 16 arts related clubs (an increase of 3 from last Autumn):

- 219 places (a slight decrease of 18) were allocated to pupils.
- of the whole school, (an increase of 6% on Autumn 2015) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Autumn 2016.

















#### Gender Analysis Autumn 2016

#### Key Stage 1

- Girls: 25 girls (39%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 25 boys (46%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

#### Key Stage 2

- Girls: 56 girls (77%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 27 boys (44%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

#### Whole School (Y1-6)

- Girls: 81 girls (69%) (an increase of 5 girls, 3% from Autumn 2015) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 52 boys (50%) (an increase of 6 boys, 7% from Autumn 2015) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

In total, 219 pupil places were allocated, in Autumn 2016, to arts related extra-curricular activities (an increase of 76 places on Autumn 2015, across the whole school).

- There were 25 girl's places (KS1) and 119 girl's places (KS2), in total 144 girl's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular clubs, including girls who were doing multiple arts clubs-an increase of 7 girl's places from last Autumn.
  - There were 25 boy's places (KS1) and 50 boy's places (KS2), in total 75 boy's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular activities, including boys who were doing multiple arts clubs-which is the same as last Autumn-stable for 2 consecutive years.

#### Gender Analysis Spring 2016

- Girls: 85 girls (77% of all girls) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 140 girl's place.
- Boys: 47 boys (43% of all boys) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 64 boys places.

#### Pupil participation:

- 351 pupil places (an increase of 146 pupil places, from Spring 2016) were allocated to arts activities
  - There were 58 girl's places (KS1) and 170 girl's places (KS2), in total 228 girl's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular clubs, including girls who were doing multiple arts clubs-an increase of 88 girl's places from last Spring.
    - There were 47 boy's places (KS1) and 75 boy's places (KS2), in total 122 boy's places were
      allocated to arts extra-curricular activities, including boys who were doing multiple arts clubswhich is an increase of 58 boy's places from last Spring.

#### Gender Analysis Spring 2017

- Boys: 30 boys (71.4%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

#### Key Stage 2

- Girls: 65 girls (89%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 35 boys (57%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

#### Whole School (Y1-6)

- Girls: 99 girls (84.6%) (an increase of 14 girls, from Spring 2016) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 65 boys (63%) (an increase of 18 boys, from Spring 2016) participated in a variety of extracurricular arts activity

Overall, uptake on pupil places for arts related extra-curricular activities has greatly increased and had a positive impact on the school: increasing pupil participation, in the range of arts activities available as well as continuing to increase the amount of boys participating in extra-curricular arts.

#### Gender Analysis Summer 2017

#### Key Stage 2

- Girls: 48 girls (68%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity
- Boys: 17 boys (28%) participated in a variety of extra-curricular arts activity

In total, 243 pupil places were allocated, in Summer 2017, to arts related extra-curricular activities- an increase of 17 places from Summer 2016.

- There were 61 girl's places (KS1) and 109 girl's places (KS2), in total 170 girl's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular clubs, including girls who were doing multiple arts clubs.
- There were 28 boy's places (KS1) and 45 boy's places (KS2), in total 73 boy's places were allocated to arts extra-curricular activities, including boys who were doing multiple arts clubs.

















Overall, uptake on pupil places for arts related extra-curricular activities has increased and has had a positive impact on the school: increasing pupil participation, in the range of arts activities available as well as continuing to increase the amount of boys participating in extra-curricular arts.

Overall, 59% of children in Years 1 to 6 participated in an arts extra-curricular club, this term.

Pupil Leadership has greatly increased, this term and includes Pupil Leaders from:

- 2 x Y6 (6% of cohort)
- 4 x Y5 (12% of cohort)
- 3 x Y4 (9% of cohort)
- 18 x Y2 (36% of cohort)

#### In summary:

- 8% of pupils in Key Stage 2 acted as Pupil Leaders, this term and led Art related activities/clubs
- 21% of pupils in Key Stage 1, acted as Pupil Leaders.
- 13% of pupils in the whole school acted as Pupil Leaders for arts clubs.
