In total 122 pupils (55% of whole school) participated in an arts extra-curricular club in Autumn 2015.

Gender Analysis Autumn 2015

- Girls: 76 girls (66% of all girls) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 137 girl's places-increase of 21 girl's places from last Autumn.
- Boys: 46 boys (43% of all boys) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 75 boys places boy's places from last Autumn-increase of 10 places from last Autumn.

- Girls: 85 girls (77% of all girls) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 140 girl's place.
- Boys: 47 boys (43% of all boys) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 64 boys places.

Gender Analysis Spring 2016

- Girls: 98 girls (92% of all girls) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 208 girl's place.
- Boys: 60 boys (58% of all boys) participated in an extra-curricular art club some participated in more than 1 arts club resulting in 100 boys places.

Overall, 73% of children in Years 1 to 6 participated in an arts extra-curricular club, this term.

Pupil Leadership has greatly increased, this term and includes Pupil Leaders:

- 6 x Y6 (18% of cohort)
- 3 x Y5 (9% of cohort)
- 2 x Y4 (6% of cohort)
- 2 x Y2 (6% of cohort)

In summary:

- 8% of pupils in Key Stage 2 acted as Pupil Leaders, this term and led Sport related activities/clubs
- 2% of pupils in Key Stage 1, acted as Pupil Leaders.
- 10% of pupils in the whole school acted as Pupil Leaders for arts clubs.
