School Crossing Patrol

After being without a Crossing Patrol for many years, I am delighted to tell you that Lincolnshire Road Safety are now looking to employ a patrol person, ideally from September. 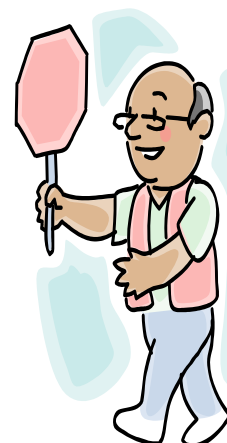
Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership

*Our School 100 Years Ago....
an extract from the Log Book,
August 1914*



August 3 Today, Bank Holiday, a day's holiday was granted. At the Flower Show today the children competed for prizes in Drawing, Writing, Brushwork, cookery, modelling in cardboard and plasticine, wood work, nature study, gardening etc.

August 4 At the Flower Show, the boys gained first prize for cos lettuce and second prize for dwarf beans. The collection of fruit was highly commended.

August 7 School closes today for the Summer Holidays—5 weeks. Miss Peel, Elsie Morris and Ivy Savidge cease duties here. Miss Peel is going to Australia to be married, and the two latter are to attend the Grantham Girls' School for a year.
