Cinematheque London Visit

Last Friday, 25th June, our Cinematheque group travelled to London to attend a screening of their film, The Ballot, at the BFI in London. Cinematheque is a global enterprise which began in Paris and is now run throughout the world, encouraging children to make films and learn new skills. In the UK, the program is only offered to schools in Lincolnshire, London and Scotland. We were one of only twelve primary schools taking part from across the county.



Throughout the year, seven children from year 5, have been working with Mrs Webster and Mrs Morris on a weekly basis to investigate film, photographs and the final film essay. This years theme was 'L'intervalle' or 'Spaces' and had to feature a character becoming jealous. The children wrote, filmed, acted in and produced the film before going to London to see it on the 'big screen.' Following the viewing of the film the children were invited onto stage to answer questions about their work.

Throughout the day, the children were an absolute joy and an credit to Barrowby School. Lots of fun was had by all and, thanks to a very kind donation from one of our parents, was topped up by travelling to and from London in 'first class' on the train. Most definitely a day to remember! Well done to all the children involved, and thank you to Mrs Webster and Mrs Morris for their hard work throughout the year.

Large Schools' Athletics

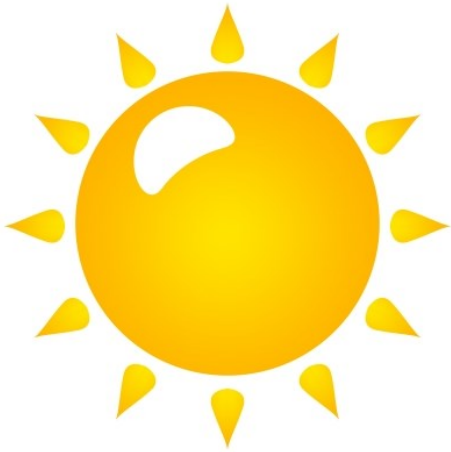
