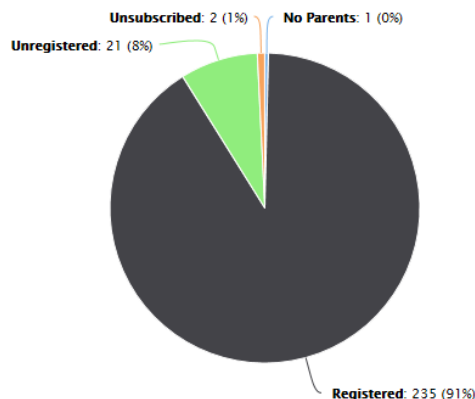
Parent Mail PMX
