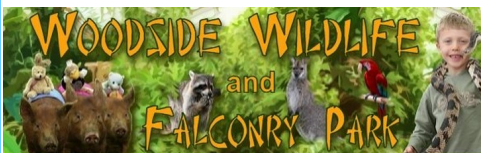

One of the highlights of this very busy final term, in school is Sports Day.

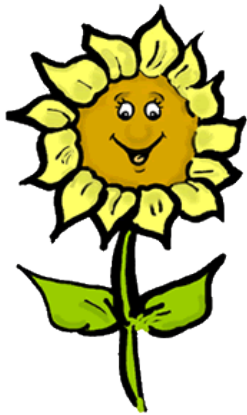

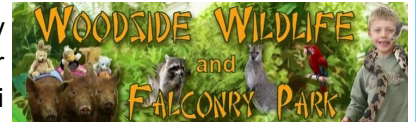
They will be bringing these seedlings home before the summer holidays so that they can continue to nurture them at home.
