## Newsletter 16th July 2021

*Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go. Joshua 1:9*

Dear Parents/Carer's

Well here we are, the penultimate week of term. It's been a funny old year but I suspect we are all looking forward to the school holidays, but for now, we look to next week.

Parents will be aware that the Government are progressing to Stage 4 of their Road Map from the 19th July where legal restrictions around COVID protective measures are being removed.

The Government also note that the cases in COVID are on the rise. This is a difficult position for the school. It is important to emphasise that our school will retain the vast majority of protective measures which are currently in place, until the end of term.

We will continue to ask parents to drop off/collect children by waiting on either: the Church Path-Reception/Key Stage 1 children or the school's pedestrian Path for-Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. This will continue next year, as we will continue to encourage parents not to congregate in large crowds, on Church Street.

We will retain the bubble structure we have adopted until the end of term, so that we can continue to limit social interactions between groups of children. This will be removed for the start of the next term, in September, after the isolation rules for children and staff change on the 16th August. More to follow on this in my end of year letter to our school family.

We will continue with our current playtime and lunchtime organisation with bubbles, as I feel changing these 3 days before the end of term might be too disruptive for the children. We will also continue to conduct acts of Collective Worship remotely, either via TEAMS or outdoors until the end of the term. We will revert back to using the hall for Collective Worship in September.

From September, we will introduce a Reception/Key Stage 1 playtime and a Key Stage 2 playtime, in the morning, so that the playground doesn't get too crowded with children, in the Autumn term. More to follow in the end of year letter.

We will continue to limit the amount of parents that enter the school building and if parents do enter we will continue to ask parents to wear a face mask, until the end of the term.

From Monday 19th July, there will be no requirement for staff to wear face masks or social distance from each other or the children and teachers will have the freedom to re-organise classes as there will be no requirement to keep the children facing forwards. These changes have been introduced before half-term, as they are simple to articulate and to understand and will not necessarily confuse children and cause too much upset to the running of the school.

These are difficult times. We are being cautious at this stage, as I do not want to have to close bubbles in school, or indeed have to ask more families to isolate than are absolutely necessary if we get a positive test result, in school.

Next week, I will be writing my annual end of year letter to parents outlining and confirming the processes and changes for September.

For now, I hope you enjoy reading this week's newsletter and learning a little bit more about school life.

On Wednesday 14th July, the whole school went on an exciting adventure over the rainbow! We watched the fabulous COVID secure theatre production of The Wizard of Oz.



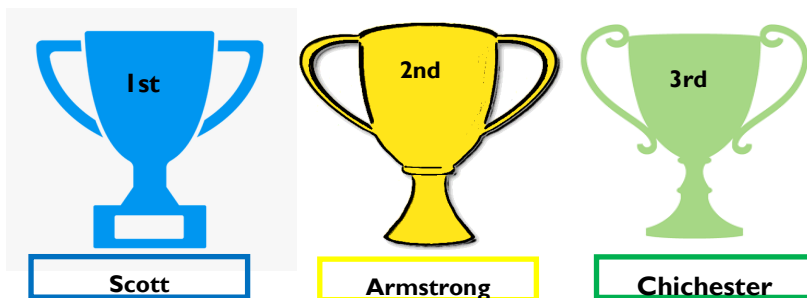

## Uniform in September

- **Boys:** Barrowby jumper, white polo shirt and mid grey tailored trousers.



As we will be returning in the Autumn term please remember:

- Girls will not be permitted to wear summer dresses with white ankle or white knee length socks; and
- Boys will not be permitted to wear mid-grey tailored shorts.

Please remember that children are not allowed to wear ear rings for school, please bear this in mind if you intend having your child's ear's pierced. Children will also need their PE kit in school along with plimsolls for PE sessions in the hall as well as trainers (preferably black) for outdoor use by Key Stage 2 children.
