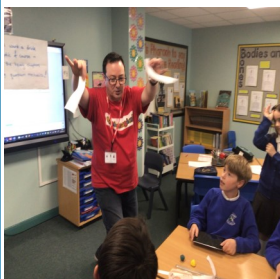

All the classes took part in a workshop with their class with David, who will display some incredible maths skills, taught children some fun maths tricks and gave them ideas and activities to try at home. School Games Mark

Mrs Banfield and the Sports Committee have been working very hard throughout the year to ensure our school family are inspired to lead healthy and active lifestyles. They have organised numerous fun and exciting events for everyone to enjoy including the Paralympic Values event, Whole School Inclusivity Dance, Skipping Challenge to name but a few.

Year's 6 'What's In The Box'

On Wednesday 25th May, our Year 6 children were joined by Liz for a workshop about different substances, in preparation for their transition to secondary school. The children defined a substance / drug as something that can alter the way we think, feel and acted then moved on to discussing what we thought were good and bad substances and the impact they can have on our bodies.

They then 'looked in the box' at some examples of substances such as Calpol, hay fever tablets and caffeine and how these can be helpful in moderation.

Important messages were shared about not sharing prescribed medication, the legal ages for drinking alcohol and the different types of Class A, B and C drugs. The children also had the opportunity to wear 'beer goggles' to experience the side effects of alcohol as well as 'drive' in the beer goggles! The children really enjoyed the workshop and it was a great opportunity to develop an understanding of substances and the importance of being responsible.

Girls' Uniform

- Royal blue sweatshirt (round neck) or cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Mid-grey skirt or Pinafore dress
- Medium grey tights or white knee length socks (with winter uniform: September-April)
- White knee length socks (with summer uniform: April-July; when wearing a mid-grey skirt or pinafore dress)
- Flat/low heeled black shoes for indoor use (not trainers)

Options:

Plain mid-grey, straight-legged, tailored trousers/shorts with no external pockets i.e. not 'Cargo style.' Other styles (including legging-style trousers) will not be permitted.

Royal blue & white checked/striped dress with white ankle socks (Summer uniform: can be worn from the beginning of April, until the end of the Summer term in July).

- Royal blue sweatshirt (round neck)
- White polo shirt

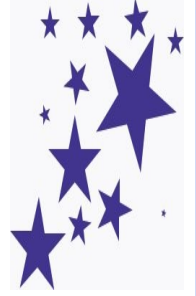

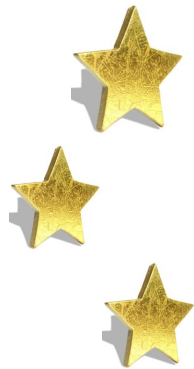

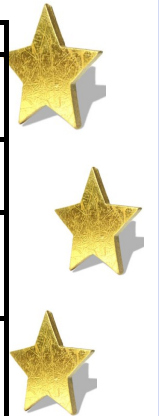

5-11 year-olds

Vaccinations for 5-11 year-olds are available; for information around local 'pop-up clinics' in the area, please visit www.lincolnshireccg.nhs.uk/grabajab or appointment can be booked on the national booking system or by calling 119.

12-15 year-olds

The contract for the Covid-19 Vaccination Team visiting schools ended on 31st March 2022. The high numbers of covid cases in schools at the times the Vaccination Team visited numerous schools has resulted in many children not having had their covid vaccinations' first and second doses.

Whilst these appointments can still be booked at a time and location to suit through the national booking system or by calling 119, the Mass Vaccination Centre at Princess Royal Sports Arena in Boston is running walk-in sessions after school, over the weekends and during school holidays.
