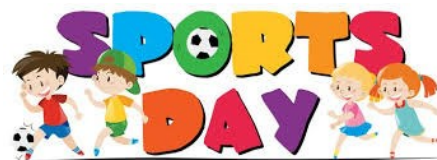

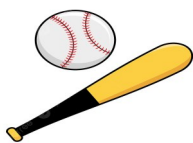
FOBs Sponsored Event

KS2 House Tournament

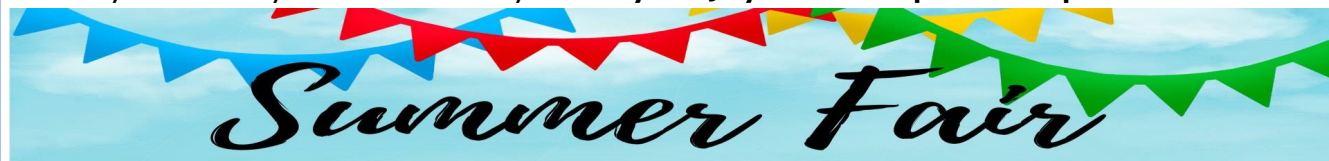
