# End of Key Stage 2 Expectations

- At the end of key Stage 2 the children will take their Statutory Assessment Tests (or SATs) in:
  - Reading
  - Maths
  - Spelling, punctuation and grammar.
- These Key Stage 2 tests will consist of:
  - English reading booklet: reading booklet and associated answer booklet.
  - English **Grammar, Punctuation** and Spelling Paper 1: short answer questions.
  - English Grammar, Punctuation and **Spelling** Paper 2: spelling
  - Maths Paper 1: arithmetic
  - Maths Paper 2: reasoning.
  - Maths Paper 3: reasoning.
- The reading test will involve three texts of which can be fiction, nonfiction and poetry. The texts will not be linked and the questions will be isolated to each of the texts. The test focuses on the comprehension elements of the national curriculum and tests this on a mixture of genres. The test is designed to increase in difficulty as it progresses. Pupils have one hour to read 3 texts in the reading booklet and complete the questions which are worth 50 marks.
- The grammar, punctuation and spelling test focuses on knowing and applying grammatical terminology with a full range of punctuation tests. Paper one is the short answer questions that are combined in a question and answer booklet. There are no contextual items in this test. Pupils have 45 minutes to answer the questions which are worth 50 marks in total. Paper 2: the spelling consists of 20 missing words that the administrator will read to the children. They have approximately 15 minutes and it is worth 20 marks.
- The maths arithmetic is designed to assess their basic mathematical calculations. These cover all four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as many more complex fraction questions. They have 40 marks to gain in 30 minutes.
- Paper 2 and 3 of the maths assessment are designed to test their mathematical fluency, solving problems and mathematical reasoning. They have 40 minutes to complete these and they are worth 35 marks per paper.
